Halloween

Parent's Questions & Concerns

At the recent Parent's Association Annual General Meeting on Sept 25th, it was important for us to raise Parent's questions. Here are the questions that have come up, and the school's response:

- There were a number of parents who raised concerns over the diaries that came home. We spoke to the school and these were temporary diaries leftover from last year. The supplier of the new diaries had some issues with the printing of these causing a delay in their delivery. The new diaries arrived in the school at the end of last week and you should all have received your new diaries by now. If you have not, please let us know.
- Parents also told us that they had paid for the text-a-parent service and not received any texts. Parents who do not use email or Facebook regularly felt they were not getting all the school updates.

The school and the Parent's Association are working together to improve communications and based on complaints about notes coming home in bags last year and feedback from the parental communications survey, most parents wanted updates to go out by email, on the website, and on Facebook. The text-aparent service is used for urgent short school updates rather than longer notifications about upcoming events or general updates. The following reasons are when the teachers might need to use the text service throughout the year:

- ✓ When a child has no lunch, sports gear etc.
- \checkmark When a child is sick
- \checkmark In emergencies
- ✓ Class texts
- ✓ Important reminders
- ✓ Changes to normal routine
- \checkmark Changes to training or matches
- ✓ To inform parents of important email or web post

The school has agreed that if there are text units left over at the end of any year a smaller charge will be asked for in the following year.

Parent's Questions & Concerns Cont'd

- Some parents also believed that the writing and maths copies sold by the school were more expensive than those available in the shops. Most of these copies are "special" or project copies and were offered free to the school as a fundraising scheme. The school has committed to reviewing the prices of these to make sure that they are charging the same or less than what is being charged in the shops.
- The other issue raised by parents before the last PA meeting was about the Student Council. The parents who contacted us felt that more children would have an opportunity to take part if children were limited to how often they could be elected to office. The children drew up their own Constitution for the Council when it was started in 2011. They agreed that children only serve for could two consecutive years. As a result, the two elected children who have already completed their two years have agreed to remain on the council as advisors only and will have no voting rights for this year. The student council suggested that another vote be held in these two classes to decide replacement voting members.
