

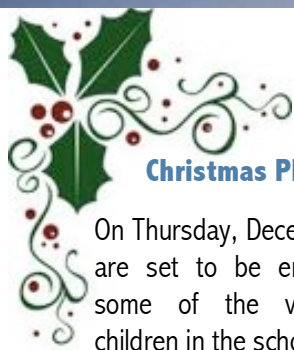

School Policy Documents (SPHE & RSE)

The school is most diligent in keeping the parents up to date with their policies. We have recently received copies of some of these documents over email. At a busy time it is not always possible for parents to read and consider them properly. We have summarized the following for you:

SPHE stands for **Social, Personal And Health Education**. RSE stands for **Relationships And Sexuality Education**. Relationships & Sexuality Education (RSE) is taught in schools as part of the school's Social, Personal & Health Education (SPHE) program.

Social, Personal And Health Education fosters the personal development, health and well-being of our children. It helps our children to create and maintain supportive relationships and become an active and responsible citizen in society. The SPHE program helps children to develop a framework of values, attitudes, understanding and skills that will inform their actions and decisions in these areas of their lives both now and in the future.

Relationships & Sexuality Education, which is included in the SPHE curriculum, aims to help our children develop healthy friendships and relationships, to promote and understand sexuality and to promote positive attitudes to their own bodies. RSE helps our children to develop knowledge of and respect for reproduction and to provide opportunities for them to develop appropriate skills to make informed decisions on sexual matters based on factual information.
