Uniform Shop

Brainy Breakfasts

We all know it is important for kids to have breakfast every day. Choosing breakfast foods that are rich in whole grains, fiber, and protein while low in added sugar may boost your child's attention span, concentration, and memory. An active lifestyle and a good night's sleep will also help your child enjoy school and make the most of the many opportunities to learn created by you and by your child's teachers.



This is particularly important at this time of year, which is when the school is required to administer standardised tests. We are all familiar with the idea of tests in school. Your child probably tells you how they did in a spelling or tables test prepared by the teacher. A standardized test is another kind of test.

The standardized tests in English reading and maths measure a child's achievement compared to other children in all schools at the same class level or age level.

All primary schools are required to carry out standardised testing in English reading and Maths during May/June for all children in 2nd, 4th & 6th classes. Like many primary schools, Robertstown NS administers these tests to all classes. A small number of children might not take the tests. For example, if your child's first language is not English, the teacher may decide that he/she should not take the English reading test. Your child may, however, take the maths test. The main purpose of standardized tests is to help the teacher plan your child's learning, and to inform you about how well your child is doing in English reading, maths and Irish reading.



The test scores are only one source of information about your child's learning. The teacher gathers information about your child's learning all the time, through observing your child at work, talking with them and looking at their work. Used alongside this information, the standardized test show how your child is getting on in English reading, maths and Irish reading, and help the teacher to identify your child's strengths and needs.

There is no preparation required for standardized tests, but it is still a good idea for children to have had a healthy breakfast and be well rested when they take them. The children will take the standardized tests as part of their normal school day and some children may not even be aware they are taking them. His Holiness Pope Francis has appointed as Bishop of Kildare and Leighlin, the Very Reverend Denis Nulty, Parish Priest of Saint Mary's Parish, Drogheda, Diocese of Meath.

The Episcopal ordination of our Bishop Elect, will take place on Sunday 4th August 2013 in the Cathedral of the Assumption, Carlow.

The position has been vacant for almost four and a half years. At the age of 35, he was the youngest parish priest in the country, and now, at the age of 50, he is the youngest bishop, and at 6'5", probably the tallest as well.
