Dear Parents/Guardians,

As this week is the last week of May, it is the last week that we are using our current planning template. Following the school calendar, school will be closed next Monday and Tuesday so we will not be planning work for these days. The weather forecast looks very promising so the children should be able to spend lots of time outdoors having fun. From next week, we will be reducing the volume of work we will be offering each day. We will also be using a weekly theme to plan fun activities. These themes will be common across the school which should help families with a number of children in the school. The theme will change each week.

The teachers will be busy this week bagging up all your childrens' books and possessions eg coats, pencil cases, baskets etc These will all be packed into plastic bags. <u>Each family will be allocated a</u> <u>time next Wednesday June 3rd to come to the school to collect your goods</u>. Please note that parents or children will not be allowed into the school. Your bags will be brought out to you. More details will follow during the week.

At the same time that you collect your books, **you are asked to return the books you have at home from the book rental scheme, You will be advised during the week which books to return**. It is important that these books are returned as we will need them next year. Only families that have returned the books or paid the cost of replacing these books will be eligible to participate in school book rental scheme for next year.

We are currently working on details of the book rental scheme and the book lists for next year. Details of both will issue in June. <u>We will also require payment for the book rental scheme in June.</u>

A number of families in the school have lost loved ones (family and friends) since school closed on March 12th. Losing a family member of dear friend is hard at any time but the situation is made particularly difficult at the moment as families cannot have a normal funeral or grieve in the company of extended family and friends. You are invited to join families in the Robertstown NS community to light a candle for loved ones we have lost next Friday at 8pm. Light a candle and pray or think about those dear to you that you have lost.

Louise will continue to set weekly activity challenges until the end of June. We hope you enjoy them.
